The Division's basic pattern of grade level organization varies according to facilities and student population.

Grade levels within the Division include kindergarten through grade 12. Generally the Division has adopted an early years (K-4), middle years (5-8) and senior years (9-12) bias. In the smaller communities, two of these instructional units may be grouped into one facility. In other settings, the overall number of students and the availability of physical space may dictate a different arrangement as being the most advantageous to both students and teachers. Also, where numbers warrant and/or facilities are available, special needs and vocational classes may be available at a local school. All Fort La Bosse schools will, however, endeavour to meet the educational needs and interests of their resident students, notwithstanding the constraints of their school budgets, the facility design and staffing limitations.

Certain students interested in developing a trade may be sponsored for attendance at appropriate centres outside the Division. Other students may choose to avail themselves of the Senior Years Apprenticeship Option programs as a means of acquiring worksite experience while still attending school.

Fort La Bosse School Division offers a variety of program options for adults or, if a more structured environment is desired, adults may choose to enrol at one of the Division's high schools. When public interest warrants, evening adult education courses may be offered subject to arrangements made by the Superintendent and Assiniboine Community College, Brandon University or other educational institutes as deemed advisable.
